

POW/MIA TABLE

The Military is filled with symbolism. This table is our way of symbolizing those that are missing from our midst. They are our commonly called POW/MIA'S. We call them brothers.

The table cloth is white symbolizing the purity of their intentions to respond to their country's call to arms.

The single rose displayed in the vase is symbolic of the families and loved ones who keep the faith waiting for their return.

The red ribbon tied so prominently on the vase is reminiscent of the red ribbon worn upon the lapel and breast of thousands who bear witness to their unyielding determination to demand a proper accounting of our missing, and the return of all live POW's, and those left on foreign soil.

There is salt on the bread plate symbolic of the family's tears as they wait.

The slice of lemon is on the bread plate to remind us of their bitter fate.

The glasses are inverted. They cannot toast with us this season.

The chairs are empty. They are not here.

Remember all who have served with them and called them comrades, who depended upon their might and aid and relied upon them. For surely, they have not forgotten you.
